The awards which were presented under the ambit of the Governor-General's Achievement Awards (GGAA) programme, acknowledge persons whose work and achievements promote community development and inspire others to see opportunities in every situation.

Among the outstanding recipients was Howard Anthony Harvey (Snr.) who, at age 16, wiped car windscreens on the streets of the corporate area in order to survive. Today he is the proud recipient of the Governor-General's Achievement Award for the parish of Kingston and, like his fellow recipients, accepted his official GGAA Pin from Her Excellency the Most Hon. Lady Allen.

Mr. Harvey's story of fortitude, endurance, determination and triumph is one that has left a solid impression on others. Due to a lack of resources the Norman Manley High School graduate had no subjects upon leaving school. Quick Fact

Have you ever heard the phrase "under the Broad Seal of Jamaica"? Did you know that King's House is where the Broad Seal is kept? So what exactly is this Broad Seal?

A Broad Seal is the official 'seal' / stamp of a state or country. In Jamaica it is that red sticker that is stamped onto official documents known as Instruments and signed by His Excellency The Governor-General.

Whenever The Governor-General has occasion to make an appointment as specified by the Constitution or the Act, such appointments are made by Instrument under the Broad Seal, with The Governor-General's signature affixed to the document.

JPs CRITICAL TO JAMAICA'S JUSTICE REFORM



His Excellency the Most Hon. Sir Patrick Allen, Governor-General, delivers keynote address at the launch of a series of Training Seminars for Justices of the Peace at the Jamaica Conference Centre on Thursday, February 2, 2017.

His Excellency The Governor-General has commended the Ministry of Justice and its partners for spearheading the massive training and recruitment of Justices of the Peace (JPs), as a critical component in Jamaica's Justice Reform Process.

Speaking at the launch for the island wide training session at the Jamaica Conference Centre on Thursday (February 2, 2017), His Excellency stated that the exercise will enhance the JPs respectability to undertake greater responsibility in the chain of Jamaica's justice reform.

"I believe that the confidence in our JPs is well placed. Of course, it is clear that the process in which we are engaged is aimed at reforming the structures and the operations of our justice system," Sir Patrick Allen stated.

The Governor General further asserted that owing to the JPs closeness to the people in their communities, they can serve as trusted and respected change agents who will empower citizens and help influence the social transformation that the nation is anticipating. His Excellency stated that much is expected of the Justices of the Peace especially as they serve in the Petty Sessions Courts and give leadership to Restorative Justice initiatives.

Meanwhile, the Honourable Delroy Chuck, Justice Minister asserted that under the training programme, slated for the next 3-4 years, the roles and functions of the Justices of the Peace will be expanded, especially as the Justice model shifts from retributive to restorative.

Justices of the Peace serve as mediators and peace keepers in local communities, reporting to their respective Custos who represents the Governor-General at the parish level.

GOVERNOR-GENERAL SWEARS-IN NEW JDF HEAD

Governor-General His Excellency the Most Honourable Sir Patrick Allen has sworn in Brigadier Rocky Meade as the eleventh head of the Jamaica Defence Force (JDF). The swearing-in took place in a Ceremony at King's House on December 1, 2016.

In his remarks, Sir Patrick Allen stated that, "this swearing-in ceremony places full responsibility for the defence of our country in the hands of a gentleman with an impressive record of service to Jamaica."

As the new Chief of Defence Staff, Meade has been appointed to the rank of Major General.

Major General Rocky Meade succeeds Major General (Ret'd) Antony Anderson who is now Special Security Advisor to the Prime Minister.

Diplomatic Week 2017 got into high gear when Their Excellencies Governor-General Sir Patrick Allen and Lady Allen welcomed eight newly accredited Ambassadors to Jamaica in a Presentation of Credential Ceremony on February 6 at King's House. The week quickly came to a peak with the hosting of the highly anticipated dinner for members of the Diplomatic Corps on February 9, during which Their Excellencies hosted over 100 diplomats in the Ballroom at King's House.

Among the countries whose Ambassadors presented Letters of Credence were the Republic of the Sudan and the Kingdom of Morocco in Africa. From Western Europe were representatives from the Swiss Confederation, the Kingdom of the Netherlands, the Republic of Finland, the Kingdom of Sweden and Ireland. From the Commonwealth, the High Commissioner for the People's Republic of Bangladesh also presented his Letters of Credence.

Six Judges Sworn in Ahead of New Judicial Term

As the justice system begins its first term for 2017, six judges were appointed to the Court of Appeal and the Supreme Court in a ceremony held at King's House on Friday, January 6. The Hon. Marcia Bennett, Custos Rotulorum for the parish of St. Thomas presided over the proceedings on behalf of Governor-General the Most Honourable Sir Patrick Allen.

In congratulating the judges, she stated that their appointment is of great importance to the carriage of justice in Jamaica and challenged each appointee to "leave an indelible mark on our judiciary which must spring from your independence of mind and dispassionate approach to the discharge of justice."

At the Supreme Court, Her Honour Mrs. Sonia Bertram Linton and His Honour Mr. Dale Palmer have been confirmed as Puisne judges following several acting appointments. They will be joined by Her Honour Miss Calys Wiltshire and Mrs. Lisa Palmer Hamilton who have been appointed to act as Pusine judges.

Meanwhile, Her Honour Miss Yvonne Brown has been confirmed in the position of Master-in-Chambers in the Supreme Court.

Retired Custos Reverend the Hon. Sophia Azan CD, JP "Woman of Abounding Faith"

The 'Duty of Care' initiative spearheaded by Mrs. Dionne Tracey Daniel, Governor-General's Secretary and some members of her staff is an ongoing project where they make home visits to the former Custodes and express appreciation for their service. The team's third visit was to the home of retired Custos Sophia Azan in Linstead St. Catherine, in June 2016.

They arrived between the midafternoon rains to a warm inviting welcome.

After the preliminaries which included the presentation of a recognition plaque from Governor General Sir Patrick Allen and other gifts, the obviously pleased Rev. Azan was eager for the team to join her as she reminisced on her time in office.

Reverend Azan attributes her call to the Office of Custos to the supernatural move of God. She explained that for over a year before her appointment in 2003, she had been feeling that something 'big' was going to happen to her. "I kept feeling something in my body... I even went to church and shared with my congregation," she stated.

She recalled that a friend invited her to a major gospel concert in Ocho Rios where the late Dr. Myles Munroe ministered to her that, "not long from now you will be very different."

Following that, at another religious service, Bishop Peter Morgan stopped the service to minister to

her saying, "I don't know but I see God moving you into something. It looks like something in government. I see you in a position but I don't know what."

Reverend Azan remembered being called to King's House by the late Sir Howard Cooke, former Governor-General on May 15, 2003. She shared the irony of the situation, "When I went to King's House I did not know I was Custos to be. When Sir Howard [Cooke] said to me, 'Do you know why you are here?' I said 'Yes Sir, I am a JP' and he said 'A JP?' I said 'Yes Sir' and he said 'They didn't tell you anything about being a Custos?' I said 'No Sir, you made a mistake. It's JP'".

"He said, 'Let me tell you, you were selected as the Custos and I thank God that it's a woman and a woman of

God... I am going to pray for you' and I said 'Sir may I pray for *you* too?'" Revd. Azan shared.

Of her most memorable moment as Custos was the experience of her installation. "I was a little nervous because I didn't know what to expect even after being briefed. But I did very well and I got a standing ovation," she remembered.

Continuing she said, "I love people and as Custos it gave me an opportunity to meet people from across the world. I've met governors, Governors-General, Presidents and Prime Ministers from all over the Caribbean. So that's an opportunity that God himself gave me. He gave me the word. And I must say I enjoyed working with three Governors-General."

"I didn't have as close a working relationship with Sir Howard [Cooke] as I had with Sir Kenneth [Hall] and Sir Patrick [Allen]. But nobody fixes King's House lawns like Sir Patrick [Allen]. He has really done a great job," she emphatically stated.

Living Purpose

Confessing her unswerving faith Reverend Azan shared that, "I told the Lord anywhere I go, even King's House, I will speak about Him. If I go to Lay Magistrate, in my deliberations I end up with my God. It's all about my God."

As Custos, Rev. Azan had the reputation of being kind, caring and responsive to the citizen of St. Catherine and her call of duty, "I enjoyed my Custos duties because it gave me opportunities that I probably would never have had. I have been enlightened to a lot of things. I have grown in a lot of things. I met some beautiful people at King's House and I believe that they are my dear friends."

The retired Custos is succeeded by Rev. the Hon. Jeffrey McKenzie who was installed in June 2015.

His Excellency The Governor-General has described the Vision and Resource Centre he and Lady Allen officially opened at the Jamaica Society for the Blind (JSB) as "another point of light which can guide more of our citizens into a brighter future."

Speaking at the official opening ceremony of the new facility on Thursday (January 26, 2017), The Governor-General also commended the Embassy of Japan, the National Health Fund and the many Foundations, multilateral organizations and individuals who have so far contributed in excess of J\$20 Million to construct and equip the centre.

"Many of you knew that establishing this centre would be challenging in a society with competing priorities but you believed in the rightness of the cause and inspired others to support it," Sir Patrick Allen said.

The Governor-General who is Patron of the Jamaica Society for the Blind, had high praises for the University of the West Indies Medical and Dental Class of 2017 for recognizing that the Vision and Resource Centre is a worth-while project deserving of their support.

The Vision and Resource Centre located at the JSB complex on Old Hope Road will provide screening and refractive services as well as assessment and counseling to persons who are visually impaired. Special attention will be given to persons with low vision who, though not legally blind, have vision impairment that cannot be corrected by visual aids, surgery or medicine.

Close to 100,000 persons in Jamaica are affected by sight related conditions, some of which are preventable.

The I Believe Initiative continues to demonstrate its commitment to educational development with the donation of computers to individuals and community projects.



Onel Harrison, the first 'I Believe' Initiative (IBI)/Monroe College/Goren scholarship recipient has successfully completed his studies, obtaining a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Information Systems from Monroe College (New York) with a 3.985 GPA.

A graduate of Ardenne High School in Kingston, Onel was awarded the IBI/Monroe College/Goren Scholarship in 2014 by Governor-General Sir Patrick Allen, who at the time said the intent was to "provide opportunities for the development of Jamaica's human resources to first world levels."

Raised in deep rural St. Mary, Onel is not a newcomer to academic excellence. He demonstrated academic brilliance and skipped the third grade

while attending Preston Land Primary School. He switched to Port Maria Primary and was Head Boy while preparing for the GSAT exams which he aced, gaining his place at Ardenne High School.

In 2012, Onel placed first in Jamaica and ranked fourth in the Caribbean for passes in Information Technology at the CSEC level. At Monroe College's New Rochelle campus in New York, he was named to the **President's List of Honours for Superior Academic Performance** every semester between 2014 and 2016.





Executive Secretary



"Many plans are in a man's mind, but it is the Lord's purpose for him that will stand."

This verse from Proverbs 19, somewhat describes Charmaine Campbell's journey at King's House. What was supposed to have been a three-month stint in 2001 has blossomed into a love affair with the Office of the Governor-General and Staff, spanning fifteen years and five months.

Mrs Campbell came to King's House from the Office of the Services Commission in late 2001 to act for someone who was on vacation. Just as her time was about to expire she was asked to stay on and help prepare for a Royal visit in 2002 by

She recalls that her first day at King's House as "work, work, work" and this has continued during the tenure of the three Governors-General for whom she has worked.


Though she was initially nervous on her first day, that all dissipated after she met then Governor-General Sir Howard Cooke. Mrs Campbell has fond memories of Sir Howard who she says was a people person and a father figure to staff. "He held our interest at heart." Workwise she said that Sir Howard was like a teacher who liked when employees took things to him directly. "He would go through the document and show you where you went wrong," she reflected.

Working with Governor-General Sir Kenneth Hall was somewhat similar. He too liked when employees took their work directly to him. One thing she admired was that he appreciated suggestions from staff in support of his function.

Of Governor-General Sir Patrick Allen, Charmaine has been guided by his stated expectations of staff as laid out in his first staff meeting. "I will never forget that in his first meeting he said that if there is a problem he does not only want to hear about the problem, but you must offer solutions as well." She is encouraged by the ethos of excellence that he has brought to King's House and his desire to see every member of staff work to the best of their ability

However, she pays close attention to detail and takes note of what happens in society generally, especially if it bears relevance to King's House.

When asked what she loves most about the Office of the Governor-General, Mrs. Campbell did not hesitate to list teamwork and camaraderie among her favourite. She is also a great fan of the King's House website which she says has been helping more persons to understand the roles and functions of the Office.

What Mrs. Campbell likes the least about the office environment is the tendency for persons to misrepresent information because they do not spend the time to ascertain all the information.

But it is not all work for Charmaine Campbell. She loves to read and do crosswords puzzles. Mrs. Campbell has a very supportive family – a loving husband and two daughters. The support she receives at home helps her to balance work and family quite well. In addition, she has a very caring and understanding boss in the person of Mrs. Dionne Tracey Daniel who looks out for the best interest of her staff at all times.

The Governor-General's role covers *constitutional*, *legislative*, *ceremonial* and *community* activities.

He acts in accordance with the Constitution and the respective laws that govern the appointment of the Executive, Judicial and other bodies.
