182 Jamaicans Honoured at King's House

One hundred and eighty-two Jamaicans were invested with nahonours by Governor-General the Most Hon. Sir Patrick Allen at the National Honours and Awards Investiture Ceremony held at King's House on Heroes Day (Monday, October 17, 2016).

Members of the judiciary, public service, foreign service, the private sector and the media and entertainment fraternity were among those invested with national honours.

Heading the list of honorees was Cptn Fenekie Rowe. former parliamentarian Dr. Kenneth

Baugh who received the Order of Jamaica for his distinguished service to Parliament and the Public Service, as well as for his contribution to medicine. He was joined by Professor Denise Eldemire-Shearer, Professor Renn Holness and Ambassador Anthony Johnson, former High Commissioner to London who were also invested with the Order of Jamaica.

The audience showed their overwhelming appreciation when Sir Patrick Allen presented two civilians with badges of honour for Gallantry. They are Orlando Brown of Ackee Walk in St. Andrew and Antini Henderson, a student of Merl Grove High School. Brown demonstrated bravery when he risked his life to rescue a boy who was being washed away by flood waters in the Sandy Gully in October 2015, while Henderson rescued her mentally challenged sister in January of this year, as fire gutted their home.

Seven members of the security forces and one correctional officer received medals of honour for gallantry. Woman Constable Crystal Thomas was honoured posthumously for her role in preventing robbers from carrying out acts of criminality against passengers on a bus in July 2015. She died in the incident.



You and I know, my brothers and sisters that, we have a rich heritage, created out of oppression, struggle, resilience and triumph over overwhelming odds.



UTech Student Receives Their Excellencies 40th Anniversary Scholarship

Governor-General Sir Patrick Allen and Lady Allen have awarded Simone Dwyer, a second year student at the University of Technology (UTech), Jamaica, the **Sir Patrick and Lady Allen 40th Anniversary Scholarship** valued at over \$1.38 million.

This will allow Simone to complete her Bachelor's Degree in Medical Technology. Two other UTech students, Raymond Stewart and Lacy-Ann Green, were named first and second runners-up and received bursaries of \$459,000 and \$175,000 respectively.

The scholarship fund was launched in July 2015 at a musical recital held in celebration of Their Excellencies' 40th Wedding Anniversary, and to which guests, family, friends and well-wishers were asked to contribute instead of offering gifts.

Speaking at the Scholarship Award Ceremony held at King's House, the Governor-General said, "We are happy to serve and uplift others as we do through the **I Believe Initiative** to empower young people."

Although he and Lady Allen would have preferred to celebrate their fortieth wedding anniversary away from public view, he said they both welcomed the idea to give back to society through the scholarship fund.

He noted that although only one scholarship was envisioned, the economic and social reality of Jamaican students wanting to pursue tertiary education was a compelling reason for the award of bursaries to the first and second runners-up.

In her response on behalf of fellow recipients, Simone Dwyer expressed gratitude for the vote of confidence by Their Excellencies and the selection panel which was headed by Peter Goldson, Secretary of the Jamaica and Commonwealth Caribbean Rhodes Scholarship Committees. The celebratory activities commenced with Her Majesty meeting her Governors-General to be followed by a National Service of Thanksgiving at St. Paul's Cathedral and a luncheon where members of the Royal Family, specially invited guests, Governors-General and their spouses were present.

Governor-General Installs First Chief Judge of the Parish Courts

Governor-General Sir Patrick Allen has installed Her Honour Miss Judith Pusey as the country's first Chief Judge of the parishes, with responsibility for the administrative supervision of work in Courts across all parishes. Justice Pusey was among seven female judges who were appointed to serve in higher positions in the Courts System during a ceremony held at King's House on Tuesday (September 13, 2016).

Her new position was created under the "Judicature (Parish Courts) Act" of February 2016, as an amendment to and renaming of the previous "Judicature (Resident Magistrate) Act" and, according to The Governor-General, represents a further evolution of Jamaica's jurisprudence.

"Jamaica has a judicial system that, in its evolution since Independence has provided a rich and highly respected jurisprudence of which we all are very proud. This significant development in the Judiciary indicates that we are growing and entering a dynamic epochal period," he stated.

In commending the judges who were appointed, Sir Patrick Allen said he was confident that they would "build on the legacy of fair and balanced judgement and reaffirm the integrity of our Judicial System." He further urged them to use their chambers to speak for those who cannot speak, especially children who are being abused and victimised.

All seven newly appointed judges were commended for their commitment to principle and duty by the Honourable Mr. Justice Dennis Morrison, President of the Court of Appeal and Chief Justice the Honourable Mrs. Justice Zaila McCalla, who urged them to be astute with their decision-making and deliberations.

In addition to Justice Pusey, the other judges who were sworn-in are the Hon. Miss Justice Paulette Williams and the Hon. Miss Justice Carol Edwards who will serve in the Court of Appeal. They were joined by Her Honour Miss Carolyn Tie, Her Honour Stephanie Jackson Haisley and Her Honour Sonya Wint-Blair who were appointed Puisne Judges in the Supreme Court, along with Miss Pamela Mason who will serve as Master-in-Chambers.

He told the team that he fell, found that he had a clot on his brain and was admitted in the hospital in January. He said that Lady Allen had visited him in hospital and that he now has difficulty walking without the use of a cane. In characteristic humor he added that, "As Dudley Thompson says I am in the departure lounge." As he eased in conversation he was eager to know the whereabouts of all the persons with whom he worked closely at King's House, particularly Mrs. Nairne, Mr. F. Merrick Needham, Protocol Consultant and Mr. Hugh Morris. He also wanted to know who is the current Aide-de-Camp and all the new Custodes across the parishes. "...who is the Custos for St. Catherine; Revd. Jeffrey McKenzie? Another pastor. We have about five pastors now," he guipped.

Memories of Service

"I've been to functions here (in Westmoreland) and when they announce me the applause is deafening," Mr. Sinclair recall of his time in the Office of Custos. When asked if he missed serving he stated that, "I don't miss the job as Custos but I miss the fraternity." "One thing is that the request for funds to support benevolent causes is not as bad (excessive) as when I was a Custos. Now-adays they don't bother. They think you got a lot of money as Custos,' Mr. Sinclair added.

Of his time in office he also mentioned keeping a keen eye on the Justices of the Peace (JP). He listed creating the first directory of his parish JPs and an Identification System for them as his legacy to the office.

"I'm not surprised. It has to be a reason for Mrs. Daniel to come here," Mr. Sinclair commented as Mrs. Daniel made presentation of gifts she Westmoreland, the Hon. Dossel Owen Sinhad carried from His Excellency The Governor-General.

"Every moment was memorable. There was never a dull moment. There was sometimes up to five engagements," Dr. Allen answered to his most memorable moments in the office of Custos of Manchester.

He also shared that the day he was inaugurated was very special because he and his wife had never been to a Custos Inauguration before. "We had no idea what to expect when we walked into the Mandeville Park. On the day there was this whole host of people; military, dignitary, police and there was great excitement with spontaneous outburst of greetings and "we love yous". Poor Mrs. Allen was overwhelmed," Dr. Allen revealed.

The first native Manchesterian to become Custos Rotulorum for the parish, Dr. Allen reflected that, "I didn't seek it. I did not know who recommended me. So the question was why

me?"

Sufficiently grounded in strong social values which espouses hard work, Dr. Allen quickly settled in his role and has served under the leadership of three Governors-General. He shared that when his last boss, a colleague prior, Dr. Patrick Allen was to be the Governor-General in 2009, he was so pleased and 'pass on all the congratulatory messages' which were being directed to him.

A medical doctor by profession, Dr. Allen is well-known for his charitable work across the parish and attributes it to lessons learnt from his very humble rural upbringing among his father who was a tailor, mother a housewife, brother and two sisters among whom the limited resources had to share.




"Through this office, I discovered an attribute I never knew I had. I had never considered myself a speaker. I did everything to avoid speaking. I think that my inaugural speech was my first public speech. When I delivered it, Sir Howard (Governor-General at the time) said that it should be read all over the country and in every school."

"Since that speech though, he has had requests to speak in as far as California," Mrs. Allen chimed-in.

"After that wherever I spoke, persons kept asking for copies of the speech. One lady asked if we have considered publishing them. I have kept all those speeches in the 17 years," Dr. Allen recalls.

One of Dr. Allen's greatest desires is for lands he acquired from part for the establishment of a Justice Centre to include a Parish Court, Police Station and military facility, the expansion of a school and the establishment of a community center be revisited by his successors.






